4. With reference to paragraph 14. There is no evidence held as to the actual date that Mr Grace claimed his permanent health insurance from Trent Services. Trent services have confirmed that Mr Grace requested a form on 03.05.11 and they received this back on 02.06.11. The first payment was made in week ending 03.06.11. See page 30 of the original submission.
5. On 08.06.11 an initial entitlement letter was computer generated and sent to Mr Grace. An example of this letter is enclosed with this submission for your reference. Mr Grace's rates of benefit changed from Employment & Support Allowance: Contributory at the weekly rate of £67.50 to Employment & Support Allowance: Income Related at the weekly rate of £105.95. See page 3 of the original decision. On 09.02.12 an award for Employment & Support Allowance: Income Related was made.
6. An extract of ESA40 notes are enclosed advising about changes in circumstances.
7. With reference to paragraph 18. Mr Grace did not submit the document at page 30 of the original submission. This was obtained by the Fraud Investigation Service and was received by FAX on 26.09.11. On 13.10.11 the office dealing with Mr Grace's Employment & Support Allowance were informed to suspend his payments.
