The compiling of checklists and flora manuals is discussed and methods for a successful product is given in the form of “Principles 1–5”. One of the hindrances to a reliable checklist are old records which cannot be confirmed because the voucher specimens are lacking or are difficult to locate. If no specimens are available, the only method to exclude the taxa is the data of their known total ranges.
