## Pioneers in eLeadership

### E-Leadership

**2014-15**

In its simple form **e-leadership** is about a “**shared community**” using aspects of technology for awareness and achievement of goals. Following our Workshop in Prague (ILA 2009) we agreed to adopted Professor Avolio’s definition.

*“**E-leadership** is defined as a social influence process mediated by **AIT** to produce a change in attitudes, feelings, thinking, behaviour, and/or performance with individuals, groups, and/or organizations.”*

***E-leadership** can occur at any hierarchical level in an organization and can involve one-to-one and one-to-many interactions within and across large units and organizations. It may be associated with one individual or shared by several individuals as its locus changes over time.”*  
~ *AIT (Advanced Information and Technology)*

**Regional Development** is often overlooked in City led Innovation and Government programs.

Yet it is in the highly interconnected communities whether inside companies or Universities or in small “start-up” groups that change and new concepts blossom.

Our work since 2010-11 in Europe was focused of developing a better way for accessing and application of venture capital funds (VCF) for innovation.

### 3) **Health**(Healthy Ageing and Exercise is Medicine)

We will be working with Dr Farmer and others in our Sept/October 2016 Seminar in Illawarra and our planned collaboration with the University of Wollongong from 2017.

### 4) **Government**(Local and Regional Government)

We plan to assist in eLeadership programs for Local Govt from 2016-17
