Professor Avolio’s 2003 definition, (adopted in part during 2009 in Prague)

“E-leadership is defined as a social influence process mediated by **AIT** to produce a change in attitudes, feelings, thinking, behaviour, and/or performance with individuals, groups, and/or organizations.”

E-leadership can occur at any hierarchical level in an organization and can involve one-to-one and one-to-many interactions within and across large units and organizations. It may be associated with one individual or shared by several individuals as its locus changes over time.” ~ **AIT** (Advanced Information and Technology)
