We promised to improve road safety

Plans have been approved for increasing road safety around Alexandra Park Primary School and Lark Hill Primary School. Traffic Regulation Orders will be implemented to stop dangerous parking and signage will be improved. Cheadle Heath Primary School took part in the Eagle Eye training delivered by the Council's Road Safety Team and also the Bikeability Safety training. A mobile camera car is being used to enforce parking restrictions and tickets issued have risen from 42 in 2014 to 227 in 2017.

"I have asked for the work to be done as quickly as possible so that the road is re-opened as soon as possible" said Philip Harding. "We are hoping it will take less than the 6 days that have been planned".
